

- **Previous reaction has occurred with contrast (Question should be asked every time test performed requiring contrast is utilized)**

Grade type of reaction (see reference page)

- Mild (go to pre-medication orders below)
- Moderate (Discussion between principle attending and radiologist must occur to review alternative imaging or appropriateness for study-
- Severe (contraindicated)

Pre-Medication orders (history of mild or moderate iodinated contrast media reactions)

- Prednisone 50 mg oral at 13 hours, 7 hours and 1 hour prior to procedure
- Diphenhydramine 50 mg oral or intramuscular 1 hour prior to procedure

Nursing orders (post IV contrast)

- Monitor vitals every _____ minutes for _____ readings
- Notify physician in radiology or ordering physician if patient complains of new symptoms (hypotension, problems breathing, change in mental status, or cutaneous symptoms)

Nursing Orders

- **Must Ask if patient is allergic to latex**
- Acetaminophen 325mg-650mg PO/PR to patient pre-procedure PRN x 1
- If the patient is on any anticoagulation (heparin, Lovenox) check with physician about holding medication.
- Accu-check pre-procedure and record in progress notes
